This exciting news was announced by Federal Agriculture Parliamentary Secretary Jean-Claude Poissant at the 2018 CCFI Summit held in Gatineau QC. CCFI has earmarked this grant money to fund its new Digital Ethnography research and new Social Media listening research.

According to a new study by The Canadian Centre for Food Integrity (CCFI), 69% of consumers said they themselves are most responsible for reducing food loss and waste. That's followed by restaurants (65%), grocery stores (61%), food processors
