- Ontario has passed <u>legislation that will protect farmers from animal rights activists who trespass on</u> their property.

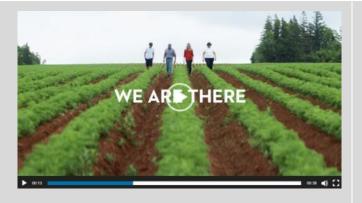
