To close this year's Public Trust Summit, futurist and digital strategist Jesse Hirsh will take the stage with a thought-provoking keynote titled "System Shock: Misinformation, Disruption, and the Battle for Credibility." Known for his dynamic, outside-the-box thinking, Jesse brings a unique lens to the evolving trust landscape—one rooted not only in digital fluency but also in grounded, rural experience. From his research hub and farm in Eastern Ontario, Jesse explores the intersections of technology, media, and food with clarity and insight.

In this session, Jesse will unpack how today's information ecosystem—shaped by influencers, algorithms, and fragmented audiences—is rewriting the rules of trust. He'll challenge participants to consider:

- Who gets to speak with authority in 2025?
- What makes a message credible when every voice has a platform?
- And how can food system leaders remain trusted when trust itself is under pressure?

This isn't just a talk about communications—it's a deep dive into legitimacy, power, and visibility in a rapidly changing world. Drawing on his work in AI governance, data ethics, and automated media, Jesse will push us to look at trust as a systems challenge, not just a messaging one.
