Canada's Food System Initiative: Moving from Awareness to Engagement



Since launching in May, the *Canada's Food System* initiative has built strong national momentum. Total reach now exceeds 92 million, with Canadians engaging deeply across paid, organic, influencer, and audio channels.

Highlights to Date

- 92M+ impressions and 620,000+ actions across platforms
- Video and audio retention consistently high, with some channels nearing 99 percent completion
- Strong organic growth and engagement well above industry benchmarks
- Influencer content delivering over 248,000 views nationwide
- Nearly 160,000 website sessions, with visitors exploring multiple pages
- Docuseries generating steady traction with 1,400+ listens and 700+ downloads

As we move into 2026, the initiative will shift from broad awareness to deeper engagement, introducing more opportunities for Canadians to interact with the content and show their support for the food system.

CCFI Shares New Public Trust Research at Inaugural CAREE Conference

CCFI was pleased to participate in the 1st International Conference on Canadian Agri-food & Rural Advisory, Extension, and Education (CAREE), held at the University of Guelph on October 29. The event brought together researchers, practitioners, and leaders from across Canada and beyond to explore the future of agriculture, extension, and rural education.

Our Director of Research, Ashley Bruner, presented CCFI's first academic paper, *Public Trust as Infrastructure*, which introduced a fresh framework for understanding trust as a core operational foundation of Canada's food system. The session generated strong interest and meaningful discussion about how this approach can inform future research, policy, and engagement across the value chain.

We were proud to contribute to this inaugural event and look forward to continuing to advance the conversation around public trust in Canada's food system.
